The Health eWorkforce Consortium was selected by the Gates-funded Stanford Open Learning Initiative as the sole TAACCT Round 2 grantee to co-develop a metrics-driven, online, feature rich course. Completed this quarter, Health Information Technology Foundations (<http://oli.stanford.edu/health-technology>) is now freely available to individuals or faculty. Curriculum prepares learners for the Certified Associate in Health Information & Management Systems certification examination. More than 20,000 staff hours from 4 groups (CAST, Stanford, Bellevue College, and the TAACCT Round 1 MoHealthWins Consortium) went into the development of this game changing 100-hour program.
